The next day at school, they all pretend to be trains, going, "ch, ch, ch, ch." They chuff around, pretending to stop at lots of different places so the passengers can get on and off.



Our new letter sounds for this week is the 'ch' sound.

Go through the name, sound and action for this letter. Children can also think of words where they hear the ch sound in them.

Chops, chips, church, chain, children, bunch.

Action: Move your arms at your sides, as if you are a train, and say ch, ch, ch
